## 3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCES

Core task 1: Carries out nautical tasks

- 1.1 Moors/casts off and docks/disengages the inland sailing vessel
- 1.2 Anchors the inland sailing vessel
- 1.3 Steers the inland sailing vessel
- 1.4 Provides instruction from the bow or stern
- 1.5 Makes the inland navigation vessel ready to sail

Core task 2: Manages cargo

- 2.1 Makes the inland navigation vessel ready for loading and/or unloading
- 2.2 Loads and unloads the inland sailing vessel
- 2.3 Monitors the cargo conditions during transport
- 2.4 Assists management with service to passengers

Core task 3: Carries out tasks related to maintenance, supply and on-board quarters

- 3.1 Carries out routine maintenance work and repairs
- 3.2 Carries out mechanical maintenance and repairs
- 3.3 Stays and works on board
- 3.4 Acts during calamities
- 3.5 Takes care of housekeeping activities on board the inland navigation vessel

## 4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE

An Able bodied seaman inland works on an inland navigation boat used to transport goods and persons economically over inland waters between various loading locations throughout Europe. The boats on which he works may vary in type, which may influence his tasks and responsibilities. Examples of various types of boats are bulk transport, cargo transport, tanker shipping, roll-on/roll-off shipping, passenger transport and towing. Depending on the sort of exploitation, ship activities can be operational continuously, semi-continuously or during daytime.

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<p><b>Access to next level of education/professions</b> After several years experience and additional training, the Able bodied seaman inland can progress to a position of Skipper inland by following the VET study course Skipper inland. ## 6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE

<p>Senior secondary vocational education features two learning pathways: the school-based pathway (bol) and the training on the job pathway (bbl). In the school-based pathway, the majority of the course consists of theory at school. The extent of the practical component (vocational practice) is between 20% and 60%. In the training on the job pathway, the extent of vocational practice is at least 60% of the course. The participant works four days a week in a training company, and attends school for theory subjects just one day a week. In principle it is possible to follow both learning pathways, but which pathway is offered will depend on the individual educational institution.</p>	
<p><b>Average duration of the education/ training leading to the certificate</b></p>	<p><b>2 years (3200 study hours) (depending on previous education)</b></p>
<p><b>Entry requirements</b> The certificate preparatory vocational secondary education (vmbo) basic vocational programme, or a comparable level.</p>
