4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE
The Animal care worker in most cases works in the retail trade or at a service business with recreational animals and pets, or with test animals. In the retail trade it relates to petshops, specialist pet stores, DIY stores and garden centres. Possibly a zoo, sanctuary or boarding kennel, a veterinary practice, a pet breeder, a dog walking service, an organisation involved in training and/or behaviour, a care farm, a petting farm, a test animal business or a practice where (bio) medical treatments are performed. To a lesser extent, the starting professional practitioner is also employed in primary production for example in livestock farming.

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE

<p>Senior secondary vocational education features two learning pathways: the school-based pathway (bol) and the training on the job pathway (bbl). In the school-based pathway, the majority of the course consists of theory at school. The extent of the practical component (vocational practice) is between 20% and 60%. In the training on the job pathway, the extent of vocational practice is at least 60% of the course. The participant works four days a week in a training company, and attends school for theory subjects just one day a week. In principle it is possible to follow both learning pathways, but which pathway is offered will depend on the individual educational institution.</p>

<p>Dutch senior secondary VET is based on qualification files, that each contain one or more qualifications.
