4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE

The All-round zinc worker covers roofs and facades and applies zinc work around roofs and facades such as components for rainwater discharge, gutters, cover frames, roof valleys and collection trays but also for zinc work applications for dormer windows and pond edges. He can work in copper, zinc, lead and aluminium. The metal is treated using traditional artisan methods, often with machines and hand tools in the workshop and on location. He/she installs, moulds and solders. He/she also carries out maintenance and repair work.

<p>Access to next level of education/professions The All-round zinc worker can transfer to a relevant qualification at level 4 such as Planner specialised contracting, Building site supervisor construction/infrastructure, Building site supervisor specialised contracting or Supervisor construction. Within senior secondary vocational education, it is also possible after completing a course at level 3 or 4 to follow the one-year preliminary course 'Managing and craftsmanship'. The All-round zinc worker can also specialise in the field of new technologies and multifunctional roofs. This requires following additional training, study courses or obtaining senior secondary vocational education certificates.</p>	<p>International agreements All-round zinc worker is not a regulated profession in the Netherlands. However, the education and training for this profession on qualification level 3 is regulated under the European directive 2005/36/EC, amended by directive 2013/55/EU. The regulated education and training gives access to regulated professions at the level of a diploma according to article 11 of this directive.</p>

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE

<p>Senior secondary vocational education features two learning pathways: the school-based pathway (bol) and the training on the job pathway (bbi). In the school-based pathway, the majority of the course consists of theory at school. The extent of the practical component (vocational practice) is between 20% and 60%. In the training on the job pathway, the extent of vocational practice is at least 60% of the course. The participant works four days a week in a training company, and attends school for theory subjects just one day a week. In principle it is possible to follow both learning pathways, but which pathway is offered will depend on the individual educational institution.</p>
