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4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE

The Skilled host/hostess usually works within hospitality companies such as hotels, road restaurants, diners, catering companies and meeting/congress centres. Within these companies, service is paramount. Tasks, products and services are primarily determined by the customer's expectations, within the company formula. A Skilled host/hostess works in a context with international customers.

The certificate issued on completion of the programme is signed by the examination board at the school where the pupil attended the programme.

Access to next level of education/professions

In the labour market, a Skilled host/hostess can transfer to become a Skilled fast food service worker. Through experience in this line of work, the Skilled host/hostess can develop to become a gastronome/sommelier. Through education and supervising and managing experience, the Skilled host/hostess can also develop to become a supervisor or entrepreneur and/or manager of a hospitality company.

International agreements

Skilled waiter/waitress is not a regulated profession in the Netherlands. However, the education and training for this profession on qualification level 3 is regulated under the European directive 2005/36/EC, amended by directive 2013/55/EU. The regulated education and training gives access to regulated professions at the level of a diploma according to article 11 of this directive.

Legal basis

Act on Vocational Education and Training (WEB), registered number of qualification (crebo): 25171 The education and training for this qualification is offered as of 01-08-2015.

6. Officially recognised ways of acquiring the certificate

Senior secondary vocational education features two learning pathways: the school-based pathway (bol) and the training on the job pathway (bbl).

In the school-based pathway, the majority of the course consists of theory at school. The extent of the practical component (vocational practice) is between 20% and 60%. In the training on the job pathway, the extent of vocational practice is at least 60% of the course. The participant works four days a week in a training company, and attends school for theory subjects just one day a week.

In principle it is possible to follow both learning pathways, but which pathway is offered will depend on the individual educational institution.

Average duration of the education/ training leading to the certificate

3 years (4800 study hours) (depending on previous education)

Entry requirements

The certificate preparatory vocational secondary education (vmbo) advanced vocational programme, combined programme, or theoretical programme, or a comparable level.

7. Additional information

Dutch senior secondary VET is based on qualification files, that each contain one or more qualifications. The information included in part 3 and 4 is derived directly from the qualification file determined by the Minister of Education, Culture and Science.
