The company's formula determines the kitchen formula. The kitchens where he works are often divided into multiple parties. Each party has its own tasks and responsibilities.

<p>Access to next level of education/professions On the labour market, a Specialised cook can develop horizontally to become a Kitchen manager. In his career, he can develop to become a chef, manager or hospitality entrepreneur/manager. Within education, a Specialised cook can develop to become a Hospitality manager or he can do a higher professional education such as Hotel education or an associate degree such as Consumptive technology instructor or International hospitality management.</p>	<p>International agreements Specialized chef is not a regulated profession in the Netherlands. However, the education and training for this profession on qualification level 4 is regulated under the European directive 2005/36/EC, amended by directive 2013/55/EU. The regulated education and training gives access to regulated professions at the level of a diploma according to article 11 of this directive.</p>

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE

<p>Senior secondary vocational education features two learning pathways: the school-based pathway (bol) and the training on the job pathway (bbl). In the school-based pathway, the majority of the course consists of theory at school. The extent of the practical component (vocational practice) is between 20% and 60%. In the training on the job pathway, the extent of vocational practice is at least 60% of the course. The participant works four days a week in a training company, and attends school for theory subjects just one day a week. In principle it is possible to follow both learning pathways, but which pathway is offered will depend on the individual educational institution.</p>

<p>Entry requirements The certificate preparatory vocational secondary education (vmbo) advanced vocational programme, combined programme, or theoretical programme, or a comparable level.</p>
