4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE

The Road transport driver is employed at a transport company, as it's own carrier or in other businesses with a transport department. His workplace is his truck in all possible variants and designs (assemblies of vehicles including trailers and semi trailers, load carriers such as drop boxes and containers). European regulations require, in addition to a valid driver's license of the corresponding category, proof of professional competence (code 95) for driving a truck. This allows the Road transport driver to transport cargo throughout Europe with most types of trucks. The certificate of professional competence (code 95) must be maintained by completing 35 hours of further training every five years. Additional rules have been imposed for certain types of cargo and trucks. The Road transport driver diploma does not cover these additional requirements.

* Explanatory note

This document is designed to provide additional information about the specified certificate and does not have any legal status in itself. The format of the description is based on the following texts: Council Resolution 93/C 49/01 of 3 December 1992 on the transparency of qualifications, Council Resolution 96/C 224/04 of 15 July 1996 on the transparency of vocational training certificates, and Recommendation 2001/613/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council of 10 July 2001 on mobility within the Community for students, persons undergoing training, volunteers, teachers and trainers.

Examples are the transport of hazardous substances and exceptional transport. Additional training courses must be followed for each specialisation. Furthermore, after completing additional training and having proven competences, the Road transport driver can advance within the sector to the position of Road transport planner or Warehouse foreman. 6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE

Senior secondary vocational education features two learning pathways: the school-based pathway (bol) and the training on the job pathway (bbl).

In the school-based pathway, the majority of the course consists of theory at school. The extent of the practical component (vocational practice) is between 20% and 60%. In the training on the job pathway, the extent of vocational practice is at least 60% of the course. The participant works four days a week in a training company, and attends school for theory subjects just one day a week.

In principle it is possible to follow both learning pathways, but which pathway is offered will depend on the individual educational institution.

Optional subjects are linked to the qualification. The optional subjects have a total size of 15% of the course duration. The optional subjects completed by the student are listed on the certificate.
