3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCES

Core task 1: Transports passengers on the road

- 1.1 Participates in traffic professionally
- 1.2 Drives according to route planning, timetable or travel schedule
- 1.3 Deals with incidents/accidents in traffic

Core task 2: Deals with passengers in a professional manner

- 2.1 Informs and advises passengers
- 2.2 Prevents problems with and between passengers and takes action
- 2.3 Receives payments and checks tickets/travel documents

Core task 3: Prepares and handles travel matters

- 3.1 Checks and takes care of the vehicle and the aiding tools
- 3.2 Maintains the administration

Core task 4: Arranges the supervision of passengers

- 4.1 Provides service to passengers
- 4.2 Supervises passengers from different target groups
- 4.3 Takes care of tour guiding for passengers during the ride

Core task 5: Plans travel route and time and takes care of vehicle maintenance

4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE

The Coach driver/travel guide generally works at a transportation enterprise (such as a coach company). He transports passengers by coach (possibly with a trailer or ski box attached) in day journeys, journeys over multiple days domestic and abroad, shuttles and group transport. According to the Dutch Law on Passenger transport 2000, a Coach driver/travel guide may only transport passengers in a vehicle provided he possesses positive declaration of health of less than 5 years old, declared by a company health physician. He is also required to possess a declaration of good behaviour.

Access to next level of education/professions The Coach driver/travel guide can develop within the company he works at and transfer to an office position as a planner or coordinator. After graduation of his education, the Coach driver/travel guide can further specialise in modules Countries 1, Countries 2, Countries 3.	International agreements Coach driver/travel guide is not a regulated profession in the Netherlands. However, the education and training for this profession on qualification level 3 is regulated under the European directive 2005/36/EC, amended by directive 2013/55/EU. The regulated education and training gives access to regulated professions at the level of a diploma according to article 11 of this directive.

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE

Senior secondary vocational education features two learning pathways: the school-based pathway (bol) and the training on the job pathway (bbl).

In the school-based pathway, the majority of the course consists of theory at school. The extent of the practical component (vocational practice) is between 20% and 60%. In the training on the job pathway, the extent of vocational practice is at least 60% of the course. The participant works four days a week in a training company, and attends school for theory subjects just one day a week.

In principle it is possible to follow both learning pathways, but which pathway is offered will depend on the individual educational institution.

Entry requirements

The certificate preparatory vocational secondary education (vmbo) advanced vocational programme, combined programme, or theoretical programme, or a comparable level.

7. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Dutch senior secondary VET is based on qualification files, that each contain one or more qualifications. The information included in part 3 and 4 is derived directly from the qualification file determined by the Minister of Education, Culture and Science. The complete qualification file can be found at <u>kwalificaties.s-bb.nl</u>, only in Dutch.

Optional subjects are linked to the qualification. The optional subjects have a total size of 15% of the course duration. The optional subjects completed by the student are listed on the certificate.
