3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCES

Core task 1: Carries out basic dental working duties to reproduce the situation in the patient's mouth

- 1.1 Makes dental working models
- 1.2 Makes individual impression moulds
- 1.3 Makes registration plates and assembles registration equipment
- 1.4 Mount working models in the articulator
- 1.5 Inspects and registers basic technical dental equipment

Core task 2: Produces the complete anatomic monolithic crown

- 2.1 Prepares for the manufacture of a complete anatomical monolithic crown
- 2.2 Designs the complete anatomical monolithic crown
- 2.3 Finalises the complete anatomical monolithic crown
- 2.4 Inspects and registers the complete anatomical monolithic crown

Core task 3: Produces partial tooth prostheses

- 3.1 Prepares the manufacture of partial tooth prostheses

4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE

The Dental mechanic basic techniques works in a dental laboratory. Dental laboratories are usually independent established companies, but they could also be connected to a dental practise or a dental prosthetic practise. A laboratory always works on commission. Their clients are dentists, jaw surgeons or orthodontists for instance.

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE

<p>Senior secondary vocational education features two learning pathways: the school-based pathway (bol) and the training on the job pathway (bbl). In the school-based pathway, the majority of the course consists of theory at school. The extent of the practical component (vocational practice) is between 20% and 60%. In the training on the job pathway, the extent of vocational practice is at least 60% of the course. The participant works four days a week in a training company, and attends school for theory subjects just one day a week. In principle it is possible to follow both learning pathways, but which pathway is offered will depend on the individual educational institution.</p>

<p>Entry requirements The certificate preparatory vocational secondary education (vmbo) basic vocational programme, or a comparable level.</p>
