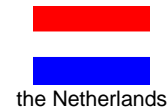


# CERTIFICATE SUPPLEMENT (\*)



1. TITLE OF THE CERTIFICATE (NL)

<b>Certificate Senior Secondary Vocational Education</b> <b>Qualification: Pastry cook</b> This translation has no legal status

3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCES
The tasks of the Pastry cook, under expert supervision, are to produce, garnish, decorate and design pastry products, such as cakes, tarts and marzipan. The products are produced for celebrations, special events and in response to special customer requests. The pastry cook uses creativity in matching product flavour and colour and in applying appropriate decorations.

4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE
Pastry cook in an artisan bakery.

## 6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE

Senior secondary vocational education features two learning pathways: the school-based pathway (bol) and the training on the job pathway (bbi).

In the school-based pathway, the majority of the course consists of theory at school. The extent of the practical component (vocational practice) is between 20% and 60%. In the training on the job pathway, the extent of vocational practice is at least 60% of the course. The participant works four days a week in a training company, and attends school for theory subjects just one day a week.

In principle it is possible to follow both learning pathways, but which pathway is offered will depend on the individual educational institution.

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### Entry requirements

The certificate preparatory vocational secondary education (vmbo) basic vocational programme, or a comparable level.
