3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCES

The most important duties of a Diagnostic technician passenger cars are:

A Diagnostic technician passenger cars is a specialist in complex vehicle defects. He is the trouble-shooter who on the basis of consultation with the customer assesses the vehicle use of the driver, and in that way identifies the possible cause of the defect. In the case of vaque/unclear defects, it is important that he knows how the vehicle is used in practice. Nowadays modern cars are very quiet and perfectly built. As a result, it is difficult to find the cause of the smallest of vibrations. Nonetheless, the Diagnostic technician must be able to identify this cause in order to be able to subsequently produce a clear work order.

The Diagnostic technician passenger cars learns everything about electronically-regulated motor management systems, applied mechanics, body electronics and passive and active safety.

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE

Senior secondary vocational education features two learning pathways: the school-based pathway (bol) and the training on the job pathway (bbl).

In the school-based pathway, the majority of the course consists of theory at school. The extent of the practical component (vocational practice) is between 20% and 60%. In the training on the job pathway, the extent of vocational practice is at least 60% of the course. The participant works four days a week in a training company, and attends school for theory subjects just one day a week.

In principle it is possible to follow both learning pathways, but which pathway is offered will depend on the individual educational institution.
