3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCES

The most important duties of a Mechanic low voltage distribution are:

Core task 1: Install, assemble and prepare distribution network for use

- 1.1 Prepares for working duties and organises work location
- 1.2 Digs trenches and wells
- 1.3 Lays and assembles distribution networks
- 1.4 Makes constructed and mounted distribution network ready to use
- 1.5 Finishes and does administrative work for construction and assembly work

Core task 2: Carrying out work on and commissioning low voltage distribution networks

- 2.1 Preparing work on low voltage distribution networks
- 2.2 Decommissioning low voltage distribution networks
- 2.3 Installing low voltage distribution networks
- 2.4 Checking and testing installations work
- 2.5 Administration and completion of work

Core task 3: Maintaining and tracing breakdowns in low voltage distribution networks

- 3.1 Preparing maintenance and breakdown work on low voltage distribution networks
- 3.2 Assisting in and analysing breakdowns in low voltage distribution networks
- 3.3 Maintaining, replacing and repairing parts in low voltage distribution networks
- 3.4 Preparing maintained/repaired low voltage distribution networks for use
- 3.5 Administration and completion of maintenance and breakdown work

4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE

The Mechanic low voltage distribution works in the sector energy distribution. He works for specialized contracting firms, installation companies or network companies. He works on low voltage distribution nets.

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE

Senior secondary vocational education features two learning pathways: the school-based pathway (bol) and the training on the job pathway (bbl).

In the school-based pathway, the majority of the course consists of theory at school. The extent of the practical component (vocational practice) is between 20% and 60%. In the training on the job pathway, the extent of vocational practice is at least 60% of the course. The participant works four days a week in a training company, and attends school for theory subjects just one day a week.

In principle it is possible to follow both learning pathways, but which pathway is offered will depend on the individual educational institution.

Average duration of the education/ training 2 years (3200 study hours) (depending on previous education)
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Entry requirements

The certificate preparatory vocational secondary education (vmbo) basic vocational programme, or a comparable level.

7. Additional information

Dutch senior secondary VET is based on qualification files, that each contain one or more qualifications. The information included in part 3 and 4 is derived directly from the qualification file determined by the Minister of Education, Culture and Science. Optional subjects are linked to the qualification. The optional subjects have a total size of 15% of the course duration. The optional subjects completed by the student are listed on the certificate.
