## 3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCES

The most important duties of a Furniture maker/(ships) interior builder are:

Core task 1: Processes wood mechanically

- 1.1 Prepares machine working duties
- 1.2 Assembles production data
- 1.3 Selects, inspects and transports wood and sheet materials
- 1.4 Applies and adjusts cutting tools
- 1.5 Adjusts wood processing machines
- 1.6 Carries out test process
- 1.7 Carries out processes using wood processing machines
- 1.8 Completes assignment

Core task 2: Assembles and finish furniture and (ships') interior products

- 2.1 Prepares work assignment
- 2.2 Selects, inspects and transports processed products, tools and moulds
- 2.3 Installs furniture and (ships') interior products
- 2.4 Finishes off furniture and (ships') interior products
- 2.5 Disassembles furniture and (ships') interior products
- 2.6 Completes assignment

## 4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE

The Furniture maker/(ships) interior builder produces furniture products mainly from solid wood and/or sheet material, possibly using other materials such as metals, plastic, glass, textile or natural stone. The products include elements for shops, restaurants, ships or tailor-made kitchens. The Furniture maker/(ships) interior builder supplies products to companies and/or private individuals.

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE	
<p>Senior secondary vocational education features two learning pathways: the school-based pathway (bol) and the training on the job pathway (bbi).</p> <p>In the school-based pathway, the majority of the course consists of theory at school. The extent of the practical component (vocational practice) is between 20% and 60%. In the training on the job pathway, the extent of vocational practice is at least 60% of the course. The participant works four days a week in a training company, and attends school for theory subjects just one day a week.</p> <p>In principle it is possible to follow both learning pathways, but which pathway is offered will depend on the individual educational institution.</p>	
<p><b>Average duration of the education/ training leading to the certificate</b></p>	<p><b>2 years (3200 study hours) (depending on previous education)</b></p>
<p><b>Entry requirements</b> The certificate preparatory vocational secondary education (vmbo) basic vocational programme, or a comparable level.</p>

Dutch senior secondary VET is based on qualification files, that each contain one or more qualifications. Optional subjects are linked to the qualification. The optional subjects have a total size of 15% of the course duration. The optional subjects completed by the student are listed on the certificate.
