3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCES

The most important duties of an Enforcer surveillance and security are:

Core task 1: Monitors public domain

- 1.1 Prepares for a surveillance
- 1.2 Performs surveillance and supervises
- 1.3 Takes corrective action
- 1.4 Makes a citizen's arrest

Core task 2: Offers service and provides aid

- 2.1 Informs and refers persons
- 2.2 Carries out (supportive) service activities
- 2.3 Provides education (information) regarding prevention of (petty) criminality
- 2.4 Lends assistance

Core task 3: Maintains safety and liveability

- 3.1 Drafts a surveillance plan
- 3.2 Deals out retribution
- 3.3 Handles the administration of imposed sanctions
- 3.4 Organises, maintains and puts to use partnerships

4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE

An Enforcer surveillance and security can be employed by a municipality, province, government of a related organisation. He can also work within public transport. An Enforcer always works for an employer as a Special Investigating Officer. The organisation in which the Enforcer surveillance and security works is part of a maintenance of safety in a certain region. The work takes place in public areas.

Based on his authority as a Special Investigating Office, the Enforce surveillance and security can make sanctions when people break certain laws and rules. Certain conditions apply to a commission as a Special Investigating

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE

Senior secondary vocational education features two learning pathways: the school-based pathway (bol) and the training on the job pathway (bbl).

In the school-based pathway, the majority of the course consists of theory at school. The extent of the practical component (vocational practice) is between 20% and 60%. In the training on the job pathway, the extent of vocational practice is at least 60% of the course. The participant works four days a week in a training company, and attends school for theory subjects just one day a week.

In principle it is possible to follow both learning pathways, but which pathway is offered will depend on the individual educational institution.

Entry requirements
