3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCES

The Road transport planner ensures that the drivers and trucks at a transport company are scheduled and deployed as efficiently as possible to ensure optimum utilisation of the vehicle fleet. He/she ensures that the drivers and trucks are deployed in a socially and economically responsible manner. The Road transport planner directs the drivers and sometimes also Assistant planners or other staff in the department.

The course of studies consists of the following compulsory partial qualifications:

- communication and management
- communication in foreign languages
- commercial economics, planning and organisation
- specific professional tasks of the road transport planner

4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE

Road transport planner, independent professional practitioner with a professional haulage company, at the transport department of an owner driver business or a forwarding company.

For example to the course of studies Transport manager or Specialist hazardous substances.</p>	<p>International agreements Road transport planner is not a regulated profession in the Netherlands. However, the education and training for this profession on qualification level 3 is regulated under the European directive 2005/36/EC, amended by directive 2013/55/EU. The regulated education and training gives access to regulated professions at the level of a diploma according to article 11 of this directive.</p>

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE

<p>Senior secondary vocational education features two learning pathways: the school-based pathway (bol) and the training on the job pathway (bbl). In the school-based pathway, the majority of the course consists of theory at school. The extent of the practical component (vocational practice) is between 20% and 60%. In the training on the job pathway, the extent of vocational practice is at least 60% of the course. The participant works four days a week in a training company, and attends school for theory subjects just one day a week. In principle it is possible to follow both learning pathways, but which pathway is offered will depend on the individual educational institution.</p>
